Glen Neal flew his Cap 232 & Dolphin ARF's and his EDF Wing and had no issues.

William McLauchlan flew his new A10 Warthog once Wayne had testflown & trimmed it out. Nice little model and quite fast. It is a Bind & Fly model but the Safety was switched off and not used. William also flew his Sparkie and a foam glider.

Owen McLauchlan did not fly. He is still getting a model sorted.

Fred Barabasz flew his experimental mini Ultra Stick and it went well.

Eric Spratt flew his Stick 1500, the repaired Sparkler, once Wayne had trimmed it, and his Crusader.

Doug Jowett flew his Timber, Conscendo and a Bixler. Unfortunately, the Conscendo nose was broken of on a bad landing.

Wayne Lewis had a busy day testflying his new Boomerang V3 and also flew the SPAD 40 and Teksumo. He also test flew Jamie's Ultra Sports, Williams A10 Warthog, Erics repaired Sparkler and Bill's repaired Boomerang v2 and they all went well.

Chris Davenport flew his Ultra Sports, told a few jokes and socialised.

Ian Partleton flew his Electric Stik and the Big Stik and had a Corsair on the ground but I didn't see that fly. **Rex Mitchell** testflew his Corby Starlett look-a-like and it didn't go well. It took off ok and danced around before landing heavily, taking out the undercarriage and wing mount. Fixable. Rex also flew his Little Toni and his Cessna with much better results.

No damage to speak of. **Mick Dye** had several flights on his Super Stick and all went well. He even did 3 touch and goes on the concrete strip. He also went to fly his big Astro Hog but it left the ground without enough speed and came down heavily on the undercarriage and did some damage. Repairable.

Bill Reid flew his repaired Boomerang V2 after Wayne trimmed it and it flew just like a Boomerang. **Roy White** flew his Ultamite Biplane and had no issues.

Jamie McLaughlan, a prospective member, had his first day flying a new Ultra Sports and all went well with this nice stable model. Jamie was in the Sale Club about 20 years ago and has been flying Helicopters recently.

Have you got the correct Wings? Several members have "Bronze Wings" and should be upgrading to "Silver Wings" or even "Gold Wings. Don't be afraid to have a go at the manoeuvres, especially when you may be the only one in the air. It can only make you a better pilot. There is more to flying RC than just flying around in circuits.
